Despite its hefty appearance and equally weighty name, Yonoh Estudio Creativo's *Sumo* has a surprisingly small footprint: The sofa is 70 inches wide, the armchair just 29. It's clear where *Quartz* gets its name: The armchair bears a resemblance to natural crystal formations. What isn't immediately apparent is that its adorable polygon cushions can be popped out of the beech frame and used as small stools. ### Stephanie Odegard

Forget silver linings: the *Louise* settee by Paul Mathieu wears precious metal on its sleeve. Patternmakers cut sheets of silver, then glue and nail the intricate pieces to the Louis XV-inspired carved-teak frame. The hammered or smooth silver skin is, at 96 percent purity, finer than even sterling, which makes this cabriole-leg chaise as much jewelry as it is furniture.
