Channel September's back-to-school energy by getting your papers in order with artist Hanna Anonen's colourful organisers for sustainable surface brand Durat. Called 'Facades', the modernist storage essentials are made from 100 per cent recycled plastic and come in zingy colours with speckled dots. Approx £480 (durat.fi).



Sweden's String Furniture has partnered with design studio Form Us With Love to launch 'Center Center', an industrial and multifunctional modular storage system made from sheet metal. Building on Form Us With Love's belief that 'static storage is a concept of the past', everything – boxes, hooks, handles, doors – can be customised, mixed and matched for endless configurations. We're calling time on the obsession with Ettore Sottsass's ubiquitous glowing 'Poltronova' mirror. Instead, let us introduce you to Italian aluminium specialist Altreforme's 'Bindoo', a collection of metal mirrors comprised of circles, triangles and squares in retro colour combinations.
